It sprouted new buds – boys! Junior Naval ROTC students from Green Run High School were our escorts and aides for the day.

Smartly dressed in their green shirts and khaki pants, they lead the flow of students from one work session to another, lifted heavy loads, and escorted the girls to lunch. They ensured that each classroom had what was needed for it's session and then participated in the engineering workshop, designing and constructing bridges out of cardboard, along side the girls.

The workshop was held at Gethsemane Baptist Church in Newport News, Virginia, on April 27, 2024. The theme was "A Day in the Life of STEM Women." It began with a continental breakfast followed by a panel discussion. The panel conisted of five STEMist - an engineer, a mathematician, a chemist, a nurse, and a meteorologist. Two of the women held doctorate degrees and one was a PhD candidate. Each presenter shared her background and why she chose her career field. Simultaneous work sessions were conducted by the STEMist in the morning and afternoon. Lunch was served between the sessions. After the last session, the panel format was resumed for a question and answer session with the paticipants.
