The branch board was busy -- Daisy Wilder, Public Policy Chair, followed conversations and proposed changes to Title IX and interacted with local and state representatives at forums such as Project 2025: What's At Stake, which was sponsored by the Hampton chapter of the NAACP.



Laura Greenfield, the branch and state Vice President for Membership, attended State board meetings and shared updates on information received from AAUW national leadership concerning impact conversations on DEI, the impact on higher education for women, and the way branches will be allowed to advertise and award scholarships to women seeking higher education and job training. The work continued as Dr. Tonya Brown, STEM Coordinator, forged on to complete back-up cameras with a small group of high school girls. The project was spearheaded by AAUW National in collaboration with Virginia Tech and STEM Lingo. The cameras were assembled, but unfortunately, they did not work because Dr. Brown and the girls were not able to find anyone to help with coding for the cameras.

Dr. Margaret Bristow, DEI Chair, kept branch members aware of any local DEI activities, some of which she was an active participated. Carolyn Stewart, branch president, zoomed into several webinars, engaged in planning meetings with the AAUW Virginia State President, VP for Programs and the State Diversity Chair, reviewed the branch bylaws, and prepared for the Reclaim Our Vote postcard campaign for the November 2024 elections.

All of this was followed up with a branch board planning meeting in late August. Plans for training on microaggression were developed. The STEM Workshop held in April was reviewed and an idea for the 2025 workshop was discussed. A new initiative for a scholarship fund for graduating high school seniors and an outline for programming for 2024-2025 were developed to be presented to the branch at the September meeting.

September arrived and the anticipation of having the Atlantic Regional Conference in Virginia was upon us. The conference was held September 27-29, 2024, at Virginia Crossings in Glen Allen. Registration for the conference was competitive, so only two of the four branch members who expressed an interest in attending were able to do so. The conference was informative and entertaining and the energy amongst the women was high. Our members returned home with contact information for women in other states, recommendations for programs, and news of the changes in policy made at the national and state level. Changes include an increase in national dues, the use of neutral language in proposed scholarships for the year, and proposed changes in state bylaws.
